2.0 – Action Items – Seth

- 2.1 Nominations
 - CALSOAP Board in need of new Chair, Vice-Chair, and Secretary
 - Gerardo: Nominates CUSD for Vice-Chair position
 - Raul: Nominates SFSB for Chair position
 - Rosa: Nominates Westmont for Secretary position
- 2.2 Vote for new Officers
 - Unable to vote due to lack of quorum; board members to be emailed for confirmation and votes for new Officers before next Executive Meeting
- 2.3 New members Introductions
 - Proposition to include Olive Grove Charter and SBCC Foundation as new board members
 - Olive Grove has successfully transitioned to online services with CALSOAP
 - Laurel: 5 OGCS location from SLO to SB; independent study for students online; teachers made accessible on site by appointment; 2 curricula for HS and elementary students; 800 students throughout 5 sites; 150 in SB
 - New members to be voted via email due to lack of quorum

- 3.0 Updates
 - 3.1 Introduction of new Coordinators
 - New coordinators since only Joanna and Eddie running CALSOAP summer services with tutors
 - Sam Hendrix-McCowan as new Program Coordinator overseeing tutors

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- Rocelia Marinez as new Outreach Coordinator overseeing programs
- Sam: Coming from Sacramento as Sac State alum with BA & MA in Counseling and used to work for Sacramento Cal-SOAP
- Rocelia: From Santa Maria and used to work for Central Coast & Long Beach Cal-SOAPs
- 3.2 Changes to CALSOAP logo and CommUnify
 - CommUnify no longer CAC through rebranding
 - Seth: rebranding a longer process than anticipated; reasons for change include:
 - to represent current services
 - avoid confusion from government commissions but "A Community Action Agency" retained due to government association for federal funding
 - colors represent SB county
 - Laura: Lots of positive feedback; less governmental association from community, partners and sources for funding
 - Rosa: Any restructuring aside from name and logo?
 - Seth: Mostly rebranding with few internal restructuring
 - Change to .org important as a non-profit organization
 - New CSAC logos including consortia for uniformity and new SB CALSOAP logo pending
- 3.3 Budget: Additional funds
 - Laura: Additional funding for 19-20 fiscal year to be spent by 2021
 - 3.3.1 Revised budget
 - CSAC received \$10 million for all consortia
 - New Imperial and San Bernardino consortia receive \$3 million; remainder split
 - 3.3.2 Tutor Salaries
 - Laura: 23% tutor budget expended so far this fiscal year
 - 3.3.3 Extended contract
 - Contract extended to 19-21 to spend \$1.3 million total
 - Partner in-kind contributions must increase to match
- 3.4 In-Kind Contributions
 - 3.4.1 Increase to match additional funds
 - Increase demands online program services such as virtual college fairs w/ SBCC
 - New equipment including Chromebooks for future in-person workshops
 - Mailing postcards rather than flyer distribution
 - Laura: 6 month backup of electronic deliveries
 - 3.4.2 2019-20 in-kind contributions
 - Partners must contribute additional \$200k for 19-20 to match for CommUnify to receive reimbursement
 - Necessary for CUSD to increase due to increased services in the summer
 - Laura: spreadsheets/sign-in to be sent to approximate in-kind for partners who do not submit reports
 - Trackers in place for partner contributions to determine over/under funds
 - Partners will be contacted to increase in-kind contributions for a 1:1 match

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4.0 – Programming

4.1 – Providing virtual services:

- 4.1.1 Tutoring
 - Sam: meeting with site liaisons to provide tutoring for Fall beginning late September
 - Challenges to online transition but tutors receiving training for quality services such as *"How to Engage with Students Online"*
- 4.1.2 Advisement/Workshops
 - Rocelia: new workshops for all grades (6-12) for late October to early December
 - Priority for seniors with applications for Fall
 - Parent workshops in English and Spanish in December
 - Peer Advisors trained and updating social media for upcoming events
 - College fair with SBCC virtually for late Oct or early November
- 4.1.3 FA Presentations
 - Eddie: Financial Aid season begins October 1st
 - Virtual senior presentations and Cash for College Workshops from Oct. to Dec. in Fall (focus on students for 4-year universities) and again in Spring (CC students)
 - Need partner assistance for volunteers and participants to services

5.0 - Discussion - Seth

- 5.1 How to provide virtual services at districts with restrictions
 - Restriction in Spring/Summer with SBUSD for moving to online not allowing outside agencies
 - Challenge in communicating with students without district email
 - Proposal to receive district email for access to outreach
 - Laurel: challenge in students not showing up to tutoring sessions
- 5.2 Partner Updates: changes to programming/services/teaching during remote learning and working
 - Laurel: Olive Grove Charter using Zoom and Google Hangouts; monitoring students via spreadsheets, invitations and hiring counselor to oversee student participation with tutors; enrollment cap for all 5 locations full
 - Seth: CommUnify offering few in-person services for homelessness and foster youth; virtual pilot for Reproductive Health program (ages 10-17) served as template on a national level
 - Raul: SFSB communicating with counselors in districts to assist students with applications; support for AVID and PEAC; launching new platform October 15th
 - Ginger: CSUCI is 90% online with only lab and nursing on campus; 200 students on campus; virtual services including tours with staff, outreach/recruitment, live chats, Zoom appointments and phone counseling available
